DOK 4:

Sample Tasks:

- Rewrite the story with a different setting but similar characters and plot
- Write a new fable or folktale with the same moral, lesson, or central message
- Write a comparison essay about the fable/folktale and another fable/folktale, describing the similar and differences between the moral/lesson/central messages.
