

Examining Student Work

- 1. (5 min) Teacher hands out a few pieces of student work from a cross section of students. The teacher explains the lesson and asks a focusing question.
- 2. (2 min) The group asks clarifying questions. Presenter answers questions.
- 3. (5 min) The group examines and describes the work.
 - a. What skills/strengths are evident? What were students able to do?
 - b. What needs are evident in the work?
 - c. What aren't students able to do?
 - d. What features of the work stand out or surprised you?
- 4. (5 min) Once several areas of skills in need of improvement are identified, the group shares research-based ideas for instruction.
- 5. (2 min) The teacher reflects on what he/she will do to continue to build on the work done with summarizing informational texts build on instruction related to summarizing informational texts.

Bring 3-5 examples of student work summarizing informational texts. Bring work from a cross section of students. Remove student names.





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
